As a measure to support marginalized groups, the University grants an additional ten marks in the entrance examination to specially-abled students, wards of differently-abled parents, and individuals who have completed courses certified by the Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI).

whom are part-time students or working professionals, MPBOU allows extended durations for the completion of Bachelor's and Master's programs. This flexibility accommodates students who may face challenges adhering to traditional academic timelines.

Through the implementation of NEP 2020's free entry and exit provisions, MPBOU underscores its commitment to learner-centric education, fostering inclusivity and lifelong learning opportunities for a diverse student community.

University's vision "Reach the Unreached" emphasizes inclusivity, particularly for marginalized and underprivileged communities. To effectively reach underserved populations, MPBOU has established a network of 11 regional and 611 study centers across MP.

MPBOU offers fee exemptions to transgenders, jail inmates, demonstrating its commitment to equitable education opportunities. The university's distance learning model is particularly beneficial for disadvantaged students from tribal, remote areas, homemakers, dropouts, defense personnel, working professionals.

MPBOU has adopted the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) and is enhancing its digital infrastructure to provide quality study materials and online learning resources. These initiatives ensure that learners receive engaging, accessible, and up-to-date educational content, regardless of their geographical location. MPBOU employs diverse strategies to ensure effective communication and outreach through andline communication, hoardings, pamphlets, and newspaper coverage, university website, Social media accounts and online groups.

MPBOU's Bhoj Darshan provides an internet-based video service offering over 300 educational programs. Students can access these video lectures on computers, laptops, or mobile devices at their convenience. Similarly, Bhojvani is MPBOU's pioneering effort for leveraging internet audio for educational purposes.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Development of Self-Learning Material (SLM) in Print

The development of Self-Learning Material (SLM) at Madhya Pradesh Bhoj (Open) University follows a structured process comprising three key phases

Planning - The course structure is carefully designed, detailing the division of content into units and blocks. The respective academic schools, tasked with developing materials for specific courses, determine the content and decide on its presentation. Extensive consultations with subject experts and stakeholders are conducted, followed by approval from the Boards of Studies and the Academic Council.

Execution - Subject matter experts, writers and editors, are selected and approved by the Vice-Chancellor for content development. The writing process is guided by university-provided SLM development guidelines. Writers are given one to two months to complete their assignments, with provisions for collaboration among multiple authors. Extensions may be granted under special circumstances upon request.

Evaluation - The completed material undergoes a rigorous evaluation process. Content editing involves expert review to ensure accuracy and appropriate writing style. Any corrections/recommendations made by the editor are communicated to the author for revision, ensuring compliance with university standards and guidelines.

This systematic approach ensures the production of self-explanatory, inclusive, and motivational learning resources, tailored to support independent learning in the open and distance education model.

Academic counsellors/coordinators play a vital role in this framework. They provide essential guidance during induction, orientation, assignment assistance, and contact classes, creating a supportive learning environment. With skills in communication, problem-solving, and subject matter expertise, these counselors address the academic and personal needs of students, fostering their engagement and progression.

The Student Support Cell complements these efforts by strengthening communication through the online portal, "Student Corner," ensuring that feedback and required documentation are promptly managed. Regular committee meetings analyze counselor eligibility, session schedules, and student enrollment, facilitating informed decision-making.

2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Process of conduct of Term-end examination Process of conduct of Term End Examination and efforts done for fair and smooth conduct of the examination

Madhya Pradesh Bhoj (Open) University follows a transparent process for the conduct of Term-End Examinations, ensuring fairness, efficiency, and integrity. All examination-related information, including assignment submission deadlines, examination schedules, and fee details, is communicated through the Admission Information Brochure, notices displayed at study centers, regional centers, and the university headquarters, as well as through the official university website. Since 2014-15, MPBOU has adopted several online processes to enhance accessibility and streamline examination procedures. These include online admission, availability of examination-related information, and digital access to admit cards, marksheets, and exam timetables. The university timely conducts examinations ensuring that question papers for both assignments and terminal exams are prepared by qualified experts to maintain confidentiality and academic standards. Designated examination centers are carefully selected based on their adherence to university standards. During the examinations, observers and flying squads are deployed to monitor activities at the centers, ensuring discipline and reporting any irregularities. The evaluation process is threefold:

- **Self-Evaluation:** Facilitated through study materials provided to learners.
- **Sessional Evaluation:** Conducted through mandatory assignments, which learners must submit on time to qualify for the exams.
- **Terminal Evaluation:** Conducted at regional centers and the university headquarters.

2.5.2 - Examination related Grievances Mechanism of the Institution to deal with examination related grievances in a transparent manner

Madhya Pradesh Bhoj (Open) University has established a Grievance Redressal Cell within the Examination Department to address learner queries and concerns related to examinations. The university follows a systematic approach to ensure transparency and accessibility in resolving grievances.

Learners can submit their grievances through various channels, such as:

- Written applications to the Grievance Redressal Cell.
- In-person submissions at the Examination Cell counter.
- Emails addressed to the Controller of Examination.
- Toll-free numbers provided by the university.
- Speed, registered or simple post.

Upon receiving a grievance, the Director of Examination assigns it to a relevant staff member for investigation. A report is prepared, and appropriate actions are taken based on the findings. Learners are informed of the resolution via email or mobile phone. For grievances related to corrections in degrees or mark sheets, the necessary updates are made, and the corrected documents are sent to the learner's registered address.

The process is made transparent through a dedicated grievance submission icon on the university's official website. For learners who have not provided a mobile number, updates are communicated through registered post.

The university's grievance resolution mechanism is student-centric, aiming for prompt resolution while ensuring that all prescribed information is collected for efficient processing.

2.5.3 - Formative Assessment Standard Operating Procedures employed for continuous (internal) assessment followed by the Institution

At Madhya Pradesh Bhoj (Open) University continuous assessment is an essential part of the open and distance education system, with assignments playing a pivotal role in maintaining communication between students and instructors. These assignments account for 30% of the overall assessment and help monitor students' learning progress throughout specific study periods. To facilitate this process, the university assigns qualified faculty members to create and distribute assignments online. These assignments are designed not only to promote self-assessment but also to prepare students for the final exams. Since there is limited direct interaction in this type of education, assignments play an important role in strengthening learning and improving the overall academic experience. The primary objectives of assignments include establishing two-way communication, assessing learners' understanding, and encouraging self-assessment. Assignments are designed to motivate learners, analyze behavioral changes, and cater to the unique needs of open and distance education. MPBOU employs two types of assignments: counselor-evaluated and computer-evaluated. The evaluation process comprises of:

- Self-Evaluation: Conducted through study materials.
- Sessional Assessment: Through assignments contributing 30% to the overall score.
- Terminal Assessment: Contributing 70% to the final evaluation.

Assignment completion is mandatory for appearing in terminal examinations. Mentor feedback on assignments further enhances the learning process.
