## ORDINANCE NO. 10

## B.Com

## BACHELOR OF COMMERCE

Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com) Degree Programme shall consist of three years of study. The first, second and third year of study will be identified as B.Com. I, B.Com. II and B.Com III, respectively.

The candidate who has passed Twelfth class under $10+2$ pattern or any other equivalent examination of any recognised Board or University shall be eligible for admission.

Every candidate for B.Com I and B.Com II session end examination shall have to offer three compulsory core course with two papers of 75 marks each. A general foundation course with one paper of 150 marks will be on offer for all three one year sessions. B.Com. III will have three compulsory courses with one paper each of 100 marks in the session of end examination. There will be Specialised optional one of which has to be chosen by the candidate. Each such optional will consist of three courses with one paper for every such course carrying a maximum of 50 marks.

For continuous study and assessment there will be two tutor marked assignments (TMA) per one year session for each core course at B.Com I and II levels. The higher of the scores in these assignments will be taken into account for each core course per session. The weight of assignment work is $20 \%$ of the maximum marks for each core course/optional. Similarly, in III year there will be two TMA's for every compulsory course and two TMA's for specialised optional chosen by the candidate.

A candidate who passed in B.Com. I or II session end examination will qualify to appear in the next session end examination.

Candidate who passed in each of the part I, part II and part III sessions will qualify for the award of B.Com degree. In determining the result of the entire programme aggregate of performance of the students in Part-I, Part-II and Part-III sessions both in session end examination and in assignments shall be taken into account. Students securing $60 \%$ or more marks will be placed in Ist class, those securing $45 \%$ or more but less than $60 \%$ will be placed in IInd class and those securing $33 \%$ or more but less than $45 \%$ placed in IIIrd class.

There shall be a supplementary examination giving only one chance to candidates who failed in only one subject.

The delivery of the programme consists of Audio-Video support assignments, contact classes, library consultation etc. A minimum of $60 \%$ of attendance in contact classes, submission of
assignments will be necessary condition for the eligibility of candidate to appear in session end examination.
