## BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN DESIGN & FASHION TECHNOLOGY

Objectives: The Bachelor of Science in Design & Fashion Technology Degree Programme shall be of three years of Study. The first, second and third year will be identified as B.Sc. (Design & Fashion Technology)- first, second & third year respectively.

A candidate who has passed 12th class under 10+2 pattern in any discipline or any other equivalent examination of any recognised Board or University shall be eligible for admission.

Duration of Programme : The duration of the B.Sc. (Design & Fashion Technology) degree programme will be of three years.

Programme Delivery and Programme Structure: The course design, course contents, counseling, programme structure etc would be decided by the Academic Council of the University on recommendation of the Board of Studies concerned from time to time and shall be in accordance with Distance Education Council norms.

The delivery of the courses will consist of the course study material, assignments face to face contact classes, library consultation and practical work etc. A minimum of 60% of attendance in contact classes, submission of at least one assignment per course and conduct of all prescribed practicals will be necessary conditions for the eligibility of a candidate to appear in Term End Examination.

Evaluation System: The system of evaluation in each course will consist of three components:

- (i) Continuous internal assessment with 20% weightage
- (ii) 10% weightage on practicals and
- (iii) Term-end examination with 70% weightage for each course with theory and practical component. For each courses, with both the theory and practical components, 20 marks will be allotted for continuous internal assessment in theory part and 10 for the practical component. 50 marks will be allotted for the Term End theory Examination and 20 marks for the term end practical examination.

In the Final year, they will be required to take up a project work on their study, 150 marks will be allotted for the assessment of the project work submitted by the student and 50 marks will be allotted for performance in the viva-voice examination based on the project. This project will be in line of two theory papers.

A continuous study and internal assessment, there will be two Tator Marked Assignments (TMA) on each course. The average in these assignments will be taken into the account for the purpose of preparation of results.

A minimum passing marks which an examinee must obtain in each subject/ paper shall be :

(i) 40% in each theory paper
