ORDINANCE No. 59

P.G. DIPLOMA IN PHYSIOTHERAPY AND NUTRITION (PGDPN)

Objective : The objective of this course is that on its completion, the students should have a knowledge of Foods and Nutrition, the digestion and absorption of various nutrients and their affects on the normal physiology of the body. The students would also learn about the various Physiotherapeutic techniques and their application to help the patients to get cured and/or ameliorate his/her illness and sufferings. This course would train the students both as nutritionists and as expert Physiotherapists.

Duration : The duration of this Diploma Course is one Year.

Eligibility and Admission : The minimum qualification required would be graduation (any faculty) and the candidates would be selected according to merit. This course is very unique in itself as it would act like a bridge for non-medical students. It would offer them an opportunity to enter into the medical career and get a specialized vocational training.

Programme Delivery : The course design, course contents, counselling, programme structure etc. would be decided by the Academic Council of the University on recommendations of the Board of Studies concerned from time to time and shall be in accordance with the Distance Education Council norms.

The delivery of the courses will consist of course support material, assignments, contact classes, library consultation etc. A minimum of 80% of attendance in contact classes, submission of at least one assignment per course will be necessary conditions for the eligibility of a candidate to appear in Term End Examination.

Evaluation System : System of evaluation in each course will consists of two components : (i) continuous internal assessment with 30% weight and (ii) Term-end Examination with 70% weight. For continuous study and internal assessment, there will be two Tutor Marked Assignments (TMA) for each course. The average score in these assignments will be taken into account for the purpose of preparation of results.

Candidates securing overall 60% or more marks will be placed in first division, those securing overall 45% or more but less than 60% marks will be placed in second division and those securing 36% or more but less than 45% in the third division.

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1. **Course Objectives :** The objective of this course is that on its completion, the students should have a knowledge of Foods and Nutrition, the digestion and absorption of various nutrients and their affects on the normal physiology of the body.

The students would also learn about the various Physiotherapeutic techniques and their application to help the patients to get cured and/or ameliorate his/her illness and sufferings. This course would train the students both as nutritionists and as expert Physiotherapists.

- 2. Course Duration : The duration of this Diploma course is 1 year.
- **3.** Eligibility : The eligibility of this course is Graduation (any faculty). This course is very unique in itself as it would act like a bridge for non-medical students. It would offer them an opportunity to enter into the medical career and get a specialized vocational training.
- 4. **Course Components** would be as follows :
 - 1. Foods and Nutrition
 - 2. Human Physiology
 - 3. Food Science
 - 4. Clinical Physiotherapy
 - 5. Practicals
- 5. Contact Session : Two Contact Sessions would be organized of 15 days each duration.
- **6. Study Centre** : Bhopal Gandhi Medical College/MLB Girls College, Bhopal.
- 7. Course Fee : Rs. 8,000/- payable in two installments of Rs. 5,000/- and Rs. 3,000/-.
