## ORDINANCE NO. 8 <br> BACHELOR OF ARTS

A candidate who has passed twelfth class under $10+2$ pattern or any other equivalent examination of any recognised Board or University shall be eligible for admission.

Every candidate for the Bachelor of Arts Examination shall have to offer three core subjects and a general Foundation Course. Depending on students interest, feasibility of resources and current relevance of different subjects such as Sociology, Economics, Political Science, Geography, History, Education, Hindi, English Lit., Sanskrit Lit., Urdu lit., Mathematics etc. will be available for students to offer as core courses.

For the one year session end examination every core subject will have two papers each carrying a maximum of 75 marks for the first, second and the third sessions. Foundation Course will have one paper carrying a maximum of 150 marks for each one year session.

For continuous study and assessment, there will be two tutor marked assignments per one year session for each core subject. The higher of the scores in these assignments will be taken into account for each core subject per session.

In order to pass in any session of the programme and examinee must obtain a minimum of $33 \%$ of the total marks for each core subject in the session and examination.

A candidate who passes in B.A. I or II session and examination will qualify to appear in the next session end examination.

Candidates who pass in each of the part I, Part II and Part III sessions will qualify for the award of B.A. degree. In determining the result to the entire programme aggregate of performance of the students in Part-I, Part-II and Part-III session both in session end examination and in assignments shall be taken into account. Students securing $60 \%$ or more marks will be placed in I class, those securing $45 \%$ or more but less than $60 \%$ will be placed in IInd class and those securing $33 \%$ or more but less than $45 \%$ in III class.

There shall be a supplementary examination giving only one chance to candidates who fail in only one subject.
the delivery of the programme consists of Audio-Video support, assignments, contact classes, library consultation, etc. A minimum of $60 \%$ of attendance in contact classes, submission of assignments will be a necessary condition for the eligibility of candidate, to appear in session and examinations.
